President's Message

HALDIMAND'S LIVING TIME CAPSUL Peter Jaycock, one of Cottonwood's trustees has completed a promotional video in which he personally does the narration. In it he refers to a time long before Canada was a country; decades ahead of the Klondike gold rush and in a time before there were cars on the dusty wagon tracks of Haldimand County. It was at that time when William Holmes Jr. laid the foundation for a beautiful new home for he and his wife Mary. While Cottonwood is an edifice to a bygone era, we can go back even farther to the roots of the property on which the Mansion was constructed. When I was transferred in 1965 by the Royal Bank as the manager of its branch in Fisherville, I was happy to learn that Helen and I were taking up residence in a close knit and caring community where the majority of its Lutheran residents were of German descent. I was also aware of an old derelict house north of Selkirk and not knowing its history, lamented that such a once magnificent structure was falling into a major state of disrepair. Having said this, in 1988, I had an opportunity to meet the late Larry Hamilton, the property's new owner and it was he who provided me with the history of the lands and the house itself. To the many folks who drive past Cottonwood, it's simply an impressive old house that was restored and is now a place to visit and hold special events. However, thanks to Larry, I learned the property's history actually dates back to the late 1700's when the Hoover clan

from Pennsylvania purchased large tracts of land in Rainham and Walpole townships. After this, I was awed by the number of local families who traced their lineage back to these original Hoover patriarchs and it was Mary who had inherited 200 acres of the original vast acreage whom William Holmes courted and married. In summary, Cottonwood Mansion Museum is simply not an impressive old house, but rather, it's a link to the very essence of the history that makes Haldimand County stand out in Southern Ontario.
