From the Desk of the Museum Manager

It has been a blur of a summer season this year; I feel that I blinked and suddenly it was no longer May but suddenly October! The summer months bring on a flurry of activity at the mansion, from large-scale events that take months of planning like our Car Show, to overseeing and coordinating the venue for 8 weddings since May. And while these events and weddings bring in thousands of new guests who enjoy engaging with the mansion and its history, this season of jumping from activity to activity can take away the focus, even momentarily, from the curation and museum interpretation tasks that I love.

With that said, there were certainly a handful of moments this summer where I got to meet and hear from descendants of the Holmes and Hoover families and beyond, and help them reconnect with their heritage. These moments are so filled with passion and energy on both sides; it truly is magical to watch a descendant connect with the same painting their great-great-grandmother painted, or spot a distant relative on a carefully hand-written family tree.

Perhaps one of the most impactful examples for me was receiving a donation from a descendant of the Hoover family. This beautifully preserved afghan was made by Mrs Seabeck in 1851, on the Hoover family farm in Selkirk, Ontario. It now sits cozily in the Hoover Family Chest from 1688, the original chest that the Hoover family used to emigrate from Germany, first to Pennsylvania, and then up to Selkirk, Ontario by the 1790's. Together, the two pieces are strong links from Hoover descendants over the years, and the next time you visit Cottonwood, make sure you ask to see these wonderful collection items.
