My first impression of Catherine proved to be a false assumption on my part because shortly after Bent's untimely passing, she fully involved herself in the community by taking hands-on participation with several local groups and organizations. In fact, when I approached her to assist me in establishing CayugaFest in 2002, she immediately came on board as the marketing chairman and her "Good News Stories" in the Haldimand Press became legendary.

Again, when Ι asked her to join Cottonwood Mansion Museum in а similar position, she did so without hesitation and this involvement was an invaluable asset in helping to create a much broader awareness of Cottonwood's value to Haldimand County. 
