Cottonwood has received great news that our application to the Ontario Trillium Foundation's Resilient Communities grant was approved. This grant was created to allow organizations to find new ways to adapt or re-imagine their spaces and programs during and post Covid. Since 2021, Cottonwood has hosted a number of outdoor events that were proving very successful and therefore it was most evident that during and post Covid, offering a proper washroom facility was vital in our hopes to continue to host large outdoor events. Therefore, the funds granted from OTF will go towards the purchase of a full functioning and accessible washroom facility. In other news, Cottonwood was also successful in receiving the Canada Summer Jobs grant and looks forward to hiring a Museum Assistant and Garden Interpreter.
