These four members have contributed many years of commitment and effort to the mansion, and it is because of this devotion that the mansion has been successful in the past. In particular, Clayton Spears took the helm in 2021, one of the most challenging years to run a museum in recent history; under his stewardship the foundation weathered the storm to steer Cottonwood in the direction it is headed today.
